**PUBLIC HEARING: Master Plan as published in The Sun & News on Dec. 22, 2018.**

**Opening of Public Hearing by C. Strickland at 7:13 p.m.**

**NO COMMENT** was made

**Close of Public Hearing at 7:14 p.m. (by C. Strickland).**

**R. Harvey** confirmed for the record, "All of the maps with the exception of the Future Land Use map, are the same and will be pulled to the existing document. There were no changes made to that. As it relates to the Future Land Use map, dated June of 2018, so it accompanied this draft (June 2018), is the final one with the exception of the inclusion of the Barry State Game Area and Barry State Rec Area. And the PC had indicated early on that they thought it was appropriate to show the outlines of those two areas on the map, and Rose indicated she would include that at such time we were ready to go to print. So that is one change that needs to be on the FLU map dated June 2018."

**C. Strickland** commented that at a recent Joint meeting they (Board/PC/ZBA) went over the Master Plan, and the Board/PC discussed what edits would be made.

**R. Harvey** commented that this meeting would be the appropriate time for the PC to make any edits to bring before the township board.

At this time, C. Strickland read the comments from A. Jansma, Treasurer, that were made regarding the Master Plan. The PC and R. Harvey reviewed each comment.

After the review, it was determined that R. Harvey will go ahead and put narratives (changes) into the Master Plan. Changes will come to Deb M. (Recording Secretary) with a recommendation for the Board of Trustees who will meet for its next regular board meeting on February 14, 2019.

C. Strickland confirmed for R. Harvey that no other changes came from Board members other than A. Jansma, Treasurer.

**Motion by R. Beukema with support from Strickland to recommend the revised draft of 2018 Master Plan (with changes made this evening) to the Board of Trustees for their review and their approval.** ROLL CALL VOTE: VandenBerg: No, Beukema: Yes, Strickland: Yes, Fiala: Yes, Jansens: Yes, Bush: Yes. **PUBLIC COMMENT: 8:00 p.m.**

**Bill Medendorp of Vista Point**, stepped up to the Future Land Use map which is to be included with the draft of the Master Plan for the Board’s approval. B. Medendorp pointed out the area of land which he owns. Medendorp commented that if his property isn’t right before the Master Plan is handed out, he will have to get an attorney. He wants to make sure he gets his land in the center “of that creek”. He noted that it is there according to the aerial view of his property.

The second point that B. Medendorp wished to make was that he wanted “all the applications I can get from running for the Trustee Board and I want all the applications for the Planning and I want to sit right over here. Please do make sure I get my applications.”

Shane VandenBerg asked B. Medendorp to point out what he (Medendorp) was talking about on the map. B. Medendorp pointed to Payne Creek and commented that he owns the center of the creek. Medendorp commented that he owns close to 40 acres, but some people say he only owes 37 acres. Medendorp wanted the map to match with the map in Master Plan, noting he was a taxpayer.

**R. Harvey** referred to County mapping, noting the base map was the key. Harvey commented, “Where a property owner felt that the county’s tax or property map, somehow doesn’t match the legal description on their deed that they should go into
