- September 2021 PCI Report and Complaint Log attached to minutes.
- Had a request for guest quarters on Elmwood Beach which was put on hold until October due to a publishing error.
- Approved an accessory building on a vacant lot on England Drive.
- PC is recommending denial of rezoning request on Bowens Mill Road. Changing the zoning from Ag to Rural Residential would not be following the Township's

Master Plan.

- Held an extra meeting on September 28 to discuss private roads, the CIP, home occupations further.
- Planning commission is asking for permission to hold additional meetings on these topics.

• Board agreed that these additional meetings should be held.

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FIRE/EMS REPORT

Fire/EMS Committee

- September 2021 Yankee Springs Township Fire/Emergency Medical Responses attached.
- Fire Station fuel tank proposal: (copy of proposal is attached)
 - o According to a study conducted, it would save \$5,760.00 to fuel onsite.
 - o Cost to do that is expected to be a little bit more than \$2,665.00.
 - o It would be an asset to the township.
 - Other townships who have done this have had no problems and have not seen an increase in insurance rates.
 - o Still doing research on the emergency shut off but will make sure that happens if approved.
 - o There will be an on/off switch inside the building to deter theft.

Motion by VanHouten with support from Knowles to approve the purchase and installation of a 550-gallon #2 diesel tank at the Fire Station to reduce the costs associated with refueling Fire Department equipment for a cost not to exceed \$4,000. - The Water Advisory Board retained Attorney Rob Thall to assist with rewriting the Water Supply System Utility Ordinance.
 - o Greg Purcell gave a brief overview of the changes the board is recommending. A copy of the draft ordinance is attached to the minutes.
 - Suggestion by Cunningham that the board ask questions and get more information and vote at a following meeting.
 - Questions were asked by the Board and answered by Mr. Purcell and Mr. Thall.
 - It will be on the agenda to vote on the ordinance in November.
 - There is a possibility of grant funds available to extend the water system.
 - Rob Heethuis has been in contact with Representative Julie Calley regarding available funds.
 - October 6 meeting minutes attached.
 - Yankee Springs Meadows water system update:
 - o The request was made by Yankee Springs Meadows for the Township to

- extend the water system but it was deemed to be too expensive.
- o They are looking at an arsenic removal system to take care of that problem.

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VETERANS COMMITTEE REPORT

Veterans Committee Report

- Veterans Day, Thursday, November 11: The committee wants to hold a ceremony at 11:11 on November 11.
 - o Music and equipment will be provided by Mick Lane.
 - o Promotions, tables and water are being provided.
 - o No honor guard or formal ceremony.
 - o Looking for suggestions for speakers on the topic of Veterans Day.
 - o Asking for help promoting the ceremony through word of mouth, social media, etc.

- PCI Contract
 - o The contract was not signed earlier this year as the Township had requested some changes last December and was waiting for the corrected contract.
 - o PCI has resubmitted the contract with the corrections.
 - o It is a two-year contract but is dated back to cover 2021 and 2022.
 - There is a clause that allows either party to terminate for any reason with 60 days' notice.

 - o Middleville is also looking at making changes with the Thornapple Kellogg Library and that may be on a future ballot as well.
