Dear Mr. Englerth,

Pursuant to our recent conversation, this letter is intended to serve as an update on the Whispering Pines obligations. As you are aware, nearly a year ago, the association contacted the Barry County Drain Commission, James Dull, to commence the process for establishing a county drain district, engineering studies necessary, and construction of the project, as required in the consent judgment entered last year.

To that end, the Drain Commissioner has consulted with their engineers for their initial analysis. He is in the process of following through with the substantive and procedural requirements of the drain code to complete the next step or steps in completion of this phase of the improvements. Once that is completed, we expect that the upgrade to the roadway will proceed. It does not make much sense to improve the road prior to the completion of the drain.

As the project progresses, we will keep the township informed as to its status.

An Ordinance to adopt amendments to the Yankee Springs Township Zoning Ordinance regarding lot coverage provisions, to provide an effective date and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

YANKEE SPRINGS TOWNSHIP BARRY COUNTY, MICHIGAN

ORDAINS:

SECTION I AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE II, SECTION 2.1 DEFINITIONS OF TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE

Article II, Section 2.1 of the Yankee Springs Township Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (11) as follows and by renumbering sequentially all following subsections.

Building coverage: That part or percent of the lot area (not counting road rights of way or easements, bodies of water, or wetlands) that is covered by all roofed building and/or structures, including accessory buildings and structures, and fully roofed porches, decks and patios.

SECTION II AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XII, SECTION 12.6 MAXIMUM LOT COVERAGE OF THE TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE

Article XII, Section 12.6 of the Yankee Springs Township Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 12.6 Maximum Building Coverage.

- A. Measurements for building coverage shall be taken to the edge of the exterior walls and shall not include projections from the structure (such as bay windows or chimneys).
- B. Maximum building coverage shall be the amount of the lot which is covered by the total footprint of buildings, attached and detached accessory structures, roofed porches, roofed decks and roofed patios divided by the lot area.

SECTION III SEVERABILITY

Should any provision or part of the within Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the same shall not affect the enforceability of the balance of this Ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

Sec. J. In all buildings in which any building drain is too low to permit gravity flow to the public sewer, sanitary sewage carried by such drains shall be lifted by approved artificial means and discharged to the building sewer. The artificial means must be kept in continuous effective operation at all times. Costs for the purchase, maintenance, and replacement of such artificial means shall be borne by the owner."

SEVERABILITY
