Maxine and Darl Beukema: The Board presented a plaque in appreciation of Rich Beukema. Rich served the township by sitting on the ZBA and the Water Advisory Committee, as well as serving for 27 years on the Planning Commission. Maxine stated that Rich looked upon the committee members as friends and thanked them for the plague.

County Commissioner Catherine Getty: Activity at the county since last month included appointing Ann Richards and Mike Cunningham to the Board of Canvassers for the county. The county also approved a new and improved benefits plan for staff and approved annual grants for the Substance Abuse Task Force.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Mike Cunningham (Heritage Bay Dr.): He urges the Board to remove the \$150,000 for the water system from the budget. The system is designed to be fully funded by its users through water rates, has historically covered its own costs, has about \$1 million in reserves. The water system has not invoiced or requested this money from the township. No justification or public discussion was provided for adding this to the budget. About 10% of township residents use the system and the other 90% pay entirely for the cost of the own private wells. He asks the Board to remove this cost from the budget at this meeting or the next one.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Prepared by Deb Mousseau, Treasurer

- October 2025 Financial Statement and Investment Report were reviewed.
- The average interest rate on the township's investments is about 3.75 to 4 percent, which is still higher than the IPA loan rate.

- The revenue sales tax sharing from the State is going down for the remainder of this fiscal year and next so the revenue needs to be decreased.
- The park project was expected to be completed before June 30, 2025. Because the completion was delayed into the fiscal year for 2025/2026 the budget has to be amended to move those expenses from last year's budget to the current year budget. This included the park insurance which increased and the professional planner's fee so the park budget figure had to be increased by \$77,920.

Fire/EMS Report:

- Fire Chief Dan Miller introduced Nikki Mendez. Nikki is a Cadette Firefighter who
 has been with the department since August 2024. She enrolled in the EMT class
 in June 2025 and passed her practical and written tests and is now a certified and
 licensed EMT. She will also start the Fire Academy in January and after successful
 completion of that will be a certified firefighter as well.
- A round of applause and appreciation was given by the Board and all present.
- October 2025 Fire/Emergency Medical responses.
 - October was a busy month with a total of 21 fire responses, including a rescue of a wheelchair user in the Yankee Springs recreational area.
 - Five mutual aid responses were given to Orangeville, Thornapple, and Hastings Fire Department. Yankee Springs did not require any mutual aid.
 - Emergency medical dispatches for the month were 49, which is higher than usual.
 - Year to date numbers for both Fire and Medical remain similar to last year.
 - Duty shift personnel responded to 13 medicals and 4 fire calls. The remaining calls were handled by personnel not on the duty shift.
 - o There are currently 20personnel at the YS Fire Department
 - o Chief Miller reviewed the training that took place in October.

Park Committee:

• The nets on the pickleball and tennis courts have been taken down as the park is closing down for the season.

Recycling Committee:

Completion of new pad and bin which is getting a lot of use.

Veterans Committee:

- Veterans Memorial Ceremony was held on Saturday, November 8 at 11:00 AM.
- There was a very good turnout and one person has volunteered to join the committee.
- The quilt ceremony was highlighted as well as the contributions of Julie Fox from the Curly Cone, and the Fire department for their work on the set up and teardown.
- Mr. VanHouten will be reassuming leadership of this event.

Clean Water Committee

- The first half of the grant money has been received.
- Pilot study is continuing and Peerless says they think the results will be very positive. It is not completed yet.

Gun Lake Improvement Board Committee

• They are done for the season and will start up again in the spring.

 - The township attorney feels strongly that this was a poor decision and the township should appeal. Allowing it to stand would set a bad precedent for the future as well as being unfair to residents who have experienced past enforcement.
 - Cost to the township is expected to be less than \$1500.00.
