the township attorney state that board members "should not" attend even if they have received public notification of a matter before the committee but there is not a law saying that they cannot. There is concern that the township could be sued because of board members having undue influence on the committee members because these committee members are appointed by the board. Further discussion took place regarding the Open Meetings Act, the formation of subcommittees, and how this resolution would affect board members if it is passed. After lengthy discussion, Mr. Heethuis made a motion to end the discussion and vote on the matter.

Discussion took place regarding what type of penalty would there be if a board member violates the resolution and whether there was a violation of the attorney contact policy. ## **BOARD COMMENT:**

**Mousseau:** Thanked Dave for the Veterans Day ceremony and thanked Mike for all his work on the early voting and election days.

**VanHouten:** Thanked the Veterant Committee for their work. The people who worked at the polls and Mike did a great job on the election. The discussions today are not terrible. Once a decision is made by the Board the decision will then be supported by the Board.

**Knowles:** The Veterans Memorial ceremony was fantastic. Nice weather and it was nice having the Scouts and the school kids there. Mike and the group of people working on the election did an incredible job.

**Cunningham:** Resigned from his position as FOIA coordinator and the recycling committee. He gave an overview of his involvement with the township committees prior to running for the Clerk position in 2024 and then made the following statement: "After 4 years that were harder and took more time than could have been expected, I waited until just about the last minute for a good candidate to show up to run for clerk. Not even a bad candidate wanted the job. I

I will not be part of this, I therefore am resigning the position of township clerk effective 12/1/2024."
